Weather Summary

Temperatures throughout the State were above normal for the week. Las Vegas reported the highest temperature of the week at 111 degrees, whereas Ely reported the lowest temperature at 40 degrees. Precipitation ranged from 0.00 in all locations except in Elko which received a trace amount.

Field Crops Summary

Days Suitable for Fieldwork: 7.0 days. Topsoil Moisture: 20% Short, 70% Adequate, and 10% surplus. Subsoil Moisture: 10% Short, 80% Adequate, and 10% surplus. Pasture and Range Condition: 25% Fair, 25% Good, and 50% Excellent. Excellent conditions for crop growth continued with hot dry days and cool to warm nights. Farmers continued irrigating. First cutting alfalfa was coming to the end, and the second crop was growing very well. Cows and calves were doing well. Forage and water supplies were well above average and calves were gaining weight rapidly. Many mid and upper elevation rangelands remained green so forage nutrition remained good.
